<b>Hybrid Poplar</b>	AC Sundancer	12m (40ft)	3m (10ft)	Male clone, no fluff	Green Yellow in fall	Spreading upright habit with fast growth rate
	Okanese	18m (60ft)	8m (26ft)	Male clone, no fluff	Green Yellow in fall	Columnar Fast growth rate
<b>Pine</b>	Lodgepole	12-25m (40-80ft)	6m (20ft)	Short cylindrical to egg shaped cones 2-5cm (1-2in) long	Yellowish green needles	One of the most drought tolerant native conifers
	Scots	18m (60ft)	5m (6ft)	Long, roundish shape, dull tawny yellow 3-7cm (1-3 in)	Blue green needles	Excellent needle retention Grows on a wide variety of soils
<b>Spruce</b>	Colorado	18m (60ft)	8m (26ft)	Long straw colored cones 6-10cm (2.5-4in)	High percentage of silvery blue needles	Grows on a wide variety of soils
	White	18m (60ft)	5m (16ft)	Brown cylindrical cones 4-5cm (1.5-2in)	Green needles	Grows on a wide variety of soils
